Springwater Grange #263

Springwater is an unincorporated rural community in Clackamas County, Oregon, about three miles south of Estacada. The historic wooden Springwater Presbyterian Church was built c. 1890. The Springwater Grange is located next to the church on land that was once the community school and has celebrated a Springwater Fair every year since 1923.

Springwater Grange is at the corner of Wallen Road and Springwater Road in the middle of the community. Agriculture and farming including livestock, nursery stock and timber are found in the immediate area of Springwater.

In addition to the church and Grange the community has several home-based businesses, the Springwater Store, and the Springwater Golf Course.

Children from the Springwater area are educated in the Estacada School District with several elementary schools, one middle school and a senior high school.

In 2014, Colton Foothills Grange consolidated with Springwater Grange and the area further south along Hwy 211 was then included in the Springwater Grange area, including the communities of Elwood and Colton, both unincorporated communities.

Primary and secondary students in Colton and Elwood are served by the Colton School District, which includes Colton Elementary School, Colton Middle School and Colton High School.

Springwater Grange #263 was chartered in 1893 and currently has 85 members including three family plans. While the majority of the members are from the Estacada area, there are members that come from all over Clackamas County to attend Grange. Springwater Grange is proud to be the home Grange of two Grange Legacy families and several other multi-generation families. Springwater Grange has had a small net gain in membership for at least the last 5 years. Springwater Grange is highly active in community affairs and is the social hub of the Springwater community.

Dear Friends,

2019 has been an eventful year at the Estacada Area Food Bank! Here are just a few things we are proud of this past year:

- We continue to serve customers at our Broadway location and our school pantry. Our combined customer counts are among the highest we've ever seen – routinely serving 500 households per month at the end of 2019 (up from 312).
- We participated in a pilot project with 10 other pantries and the Oregon Food Bank to increase access to food for those who need it. Called the Open Distribution Pilot, this project strives to increase food access, choice, and dignity to our customers, removing food and visit limits.
- Working with community partners, we have been able to provide warm coats, hats, gloves, socks, and scarves to many of our customers. As our number of houseless customers has increased (17% of our customers), these warm items can make a big difference!
- We distributed 280,000 pounds of food – 78,000 of these pounds came to us from local donations!

None of this could be done without you, our donors! Our records show that in 2019, you donated a total of \$401. The Estacada Area Food Bank Board of Directors, staff, volunteers, and our customers thank you for your support in working toward our mission of eliminating hunger in the Estacada area.

Springwater Collects Pill Bottles

“Caring for a needy world with the things we throw away” says Rev. Wendell Mettey, founder of Matthew 25: Ministries. In developing countries, medicines, when actually obtainable, are often dispensed into hands, pockets or leaves, or often the pills are wrapped in paper scraps. They have no protection from moisture or the elements. And they certainly are not safely out of the reach of small children; you can’t really safety-proof a piece of paper. Those orange pill bottles that are taken for granted in the US are gratefully received in many parts of the world.

Springwater Grange #263, Clackamas County voted at their December meeting to start collecting used prescription and over the counter bottles for this program and bottles are arriving.



Matthew 25: Ministries Pill Bottle Collection

A new project for Springwater Grange in 2019 was the Matthew 25 Ministries Pill Bottle Collection and donation program.

Matthew 25: Ministries accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies and for shredding and recycling. Our pill bottle program, started in December 2019, fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment.

Since we just started this project, we have no results yet. Once we collect enough bottles, we will be sorting the bottles by color and type, removing labels, leaving no glue or residue., washing bottles in very hot water and dish soap. After rinsing and drying thoroughly we will replace lids on and place the recapped bottles in large Ziplock bags marked “Clean Bottles.”

They will be boxed and mailed to the organization in Ohio. There they will be added with medical supplies and be shipped where needed around the world.
